**Congratulations to our Perfect Attendance Winner, Avery Savage. Avery will have free entries to all the 2025 South West Trillium shows. Coach Jenna Tranter was again the winner of the Perfect Attendance Coach award! Our Perfect Attendance program is being offered again in 2026.**

Please remember that both rider, owner and horse must have their memberships/horse recording in place before they compete in order to accumulate points. Horses in Bronze Divisions or the Hack Division do not need a Horse Recording

# CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

Competitors may only collect points if they have a current THJA membership.

Points are not retroactive if memberships were not in place at the time of competition.

The 50% rule for Champs qualifications has been waived. Competitors must compete (ie. Marked on a judge's card) at a minimum of one (1) THJA show in order to qualify for their respective class/division offered at the Championship Show.

The THJA will be accepting points collected at any Ontario Trillium show towards Trillium Championships qualification. Competitors declare their home zone by purchasing a membership in the zone they wish to represent at Champs. Competitors may show on their home zone and at any other THJA show to collect additional points towards Champs.

The THJA will maintain a central points list that will reflect each member's standing in the organization as a whole. For 2025, each of 6 eligible zones will receive eight spots per division/class for Champs but, in the event that there are remaining spaces, they will go to the next highest ranked competitor on the centralized points list, up to 49 entries.

Both riders and owners must have THJA memberships to collect points towards Championship Show and Zone Awards

Points towards Championship Show and Zone Awards are calculated at each show based on the number of riders in the class, a standard multiplier factor, and the placings 1st to 6th. Please note that this is different than how points are calculated for Champion and Reserve Champion at each show.

NOTE: Zones may still set minimum show count requirements to qualify for year end awards

Qualified Championship entries are limited to two (2) Divisions, the Hack Division, Equitation/Medal Classes & Specialty Classes at the Championship Show.

# QUALIFICATION PROCESS FOR SOUTH WEST ZONE YEAR END AWARDS

Competitors may only collect points if they have a current THJA membership in the South West Zone

Only points earned at South West Zone shows will count towards South West Zone Year End Awards.

Competitors must compete (complete = marked on a judge's card) at a minimum of 50% of the shows hosted on the South West Zone. This year there are 5 shows, which means that you must compete at 3 shows to qualify. This number may be reduced if your division/class does not run at every show.

Points cannot be awarded retroactively, or on a temporary horse recording.

Both riders and owners must have a current THJA Membership. Riders must have a membership in the South West zone. We will accept an owner's THJA membership if it is in another zone.

The top seven (7) competitors in each class and division will receive Year End Awards.

## **EQUESTRIAN CANADA: STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLE**

The Trillium shows listed in this program are recognized provincial circuit competitions of Equestrian Canada and are governed by the rules of the Federation.

EC requires adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction. All participants shall be bound by the Horse Welfare Code of Conduct.

EC is committed to:

- upholding the welfare of the horse, regardless of monetary value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to maltreatment;
- ensuring that owners, trainers, and exhibitors and their agents exercise appropriate care and responsibility in the handling, treatment, and transportation of their horses, as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- providing for the continuous wellbeing of the horse by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, and safety;
- continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- requiring owners, trainers, and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and,
- reviewing, revising, and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

Neither the South West Trillium Circuit, the Show committee, the Show facilities, the PTSO, officials, volunteers and the owners or any of its staff or agents shall be in any way liable for any accident, injury, damage, loss, or for any other matter that may happen, from any cause or circumstances whatsoever to competitors, exhibitors, members, or their agents or to anyone on the competition grounds or to any animal or article exhibited or to any property brought on the competition grounds or for any other loss, claim, matter, circumstance, or even whatsoever in connection with or arising out of or attributable to the competition or any journey to or from the competition. It is understood and agreed that under no circumstances shall the Southwest Trillium Circuit and All Show facilities, its owners, agents, or employees be liable for any loss, damages, claims, or costs occasioned or suffered by any competitor, exhibitor, member, or their agents, directly or indirectly, howsoever arising, including without limitation, losses, damages, claims, or costs as a result of the Southwest Trillium Circuit and All Show facilities, its owners, agents, or employees from and against any and all such loss, claims, or costs.

## LACEY MAY JAMIESON MEMORIAL AWARD

Lacey May Jamieson (1997 – 2013) is fondly remembered and honoured each year with the awarding of the Lacey May Jamieson Memorial Trophy. This award is lovingly sponsored each year by Vicki Edgar of Cohen Highly Law Firm and is presented to the Zone Champion of the 1.1m Jumper Division. Lacey Jamieson was a hard-working and dedicated rider, who competed on the South West Trillium Circuit. She was always known to have a smile on her face and a great positive attitude, as well as being helpful and encouraging to her fellow competitors. She was well liked by our local equestrian community and also, with the help of Social Media, the Global equestrian community. Sadly, on October 13, 2013 at the age of 16, Lacey passed away suddenly of a rare blood disease called Hemophagocytic Lymphohistiocytosis (HLH). Lacey's bond with horses, presence and beautiful smile are sadly missed by all of the South West Community.

Riley Dobson (2000 – 2016) was an active competitor on the Ontario Trillium Circuit, in both the Central West and South West regions. Tragically, on February 22, 2016, Riley passed away due to complications from a helicopter accident. Riley made his mark on the South West community in a short time, forming many strong friendships, and is sadly missed. The Riley Dobson Memorial Award is a nominated award open to a South West Trillium Hunter Jumper Association member who exemplifies the qualities most remembered in Riley. Riley was known for his desire to learn; for his hard work and dedication to the sport; for supporting all other competitors; for his mismatched socks, and for always putting the horse first. ## RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. South West Trillium Shows are sanctioned as Silver and Bronze competition member of Equestrian Canada c/o House of Sport 2451 Riverside Drive, Ottawa, Ontario, K1H 7X7 and are governed by the rules of EC.
2. Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book
3. Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person(s) responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition.
4. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC-sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition
5. All Canadian entries are required to hold an EC Horse Recording and have paid the EC Horse Recording annual Activation Fee to compete, or, a Temporary Horse Registration form must be purchased at each competition entered. Foreign entries must sign an affidavit. (See A404). Horses entered in the Hack Division or Bronze Divisions only, are not required to have an EC Horse Recording.

6. Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control while at the event location.
7. Any athlete at an EC sanctioned competition may be selected for human anti-doping as outlined in the Canadian Anti-Doping Program (CADP) and administered by Sport Integrity Canada. Please see EC General Regulations Section A - Appendix A1, Policy on Human Medications for details.
8. All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations.
9. When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.
10. FEI Schooling Rules will be in force.

**11. Accidents and Return to Play** – See EC Rule (A101) for full details This rule applies to all SWTHJA shows. In the event of a fall/accident where a concussion can be reasonably suspected, the competitor must receive medical clearance by qualified medical personnel onsite, through the EC Accident Injury Report Form before continuing. If the qualified medical personnel suspects a concussion, or believes that the competitor may be at risk of concussion due to the nature of the fall or impact, the competitor is suspended from competition until medically released. Suspended competitors must submit the EC Return to Play Form to EC which must be completed by a licensed physician. The EC Return to Play Form will be processed by EC within two business days, at which point the competitor will be removed from the EC Medical Suspension list and may return to regular competition. If the competitor wishes to compete at their own risk after being medically released by a physician but before the EC processing period of the form, the competitor must also submit a copy of the EC Return to Play Form to the show secretary.

**12. Person Responsible** – See EC Glossary The Person Responsible (PR) for a horse must be an adult who has, or shares responsibility for the care, training, custody, and performance of the horse and who has official responsibility for that horse under EC Rules. The PR is liable under the penalty provisions of the applicable EC Rules for any rule violations. Every entry form for an EC sanctioned competition must identify the PR and be signed by the PR. The Person Responsible is ultimately responsible for the condition, fitness and management of the horse and is alone responsible for any act performed by himself/ herself or by any other person with authorized access to the horse in the stables, elsewhere on the grounds, or while the horse is being ridden, driven or exercised. A: For adult entries into EC sanctioned competitions the PR shall be either the trainer, the owner of the horse of the competitor who rides or drives the horse during the EC sanctioned competition. B: For Junior entries into EC sanctioned competitions the Junior competitor cannot be the PR. For Junior entries the PR may be either the trainer, the owner of the horse, or a parent/guardian of the Junior competitor.

13. Article A905 Headgear – At all times, persons mounted at an EC-sanctioned event location must wear approved protective headgear. Protective headgear must be: a) approved by an accredited certification organization; b) properly fitted; and c) securely fastened by a safety harness permanently affixed to the helmet. Protective headgear must be certified under one of the following standards: ASTM (American Society for Testing Materials), or SEI (Safety Equipment Institute, Inc.); BSI/BS EN (British Standards Institution); EN (European Union Standards); AS/NZS (Australian/New Zealand Standards); or CE VG1 01.040 2014-12. EC and SWTHJA make no representation or warranty, expressed or implied, about any approved protective headgear. EC and SWTHJA caution riders that serious injury or death may result despite wearing such headgear, as all equestrian sports involve inherent risk, and no protective headgear can protect against all foreseeable injury.

14. Article A102 Safe Sport Environments 1. Effective 2022, EC Sport License holders at least 18 years of age must complete recognized safe sport training modules addressing the recognition and prevention of maltreatment in sport and concussion. 2. Effective 2022, Coach Status is required to engage in coaching activities at EC sanctioned events.

15. Every entry will be provided an identification number by the competition organizing committee which must be worn and visible at all times in the schooling and/or exercise areas as well as in the competition ring.

16. Jogging. Horses are required to jog for soundness in all except miscellaneous hunter classes. Jog for soundness using either Option A or Option B below. Management must state in the competition prize list which method of jogging will be used. Horses/ponies that are unsound will be eliminated and ineligible for an award in that class. The judge's decision regarding soundness is final.

Option A: Horses/ponies are required to trot a circle on a loose rein at the end of each over fences performance. Horses/ponies may be asked to return to the ring and trot another circle at the judge's discretion.

Option B: Horses/ponies will be jogged together with the rider unmounted in the judge's order of preference. Two additional entries in addition to the number of ribbons must jog if there are sufficient entries. Horses/ponies may be asked to rejoin at the judge's discretion. A horse/pony may not leave the ring until the jog has been declared official by the judge, or it will be eliminated. A horse that is unruly, one that breaks away from the handler or one whose actions threaten to endanger the rider, handler, other exhibitors or their entries will be eliminated.

17. Horses are limited to competing in two (2) Divisions, the Hack Division, Equitation/Medal Classes & Specialty Classes at any South West Trillium Show.

18. A Protest must be made in writing and addressed to the secretary of the OC at the event which the matter under consideration occurs. Every Protest must be signed and must be accompanied by a fee as set out in the Schedule of Fees. (Note that protesting a horse's height also carries a fee as set out in the Schedule of Fees).

19. A signed, open cheque or the value of the full entry fee in cash, must be provided to the show secretary before the competitors' number will be issued.

20. Shows of the SWTHJA reserve the right to refuse any entries at their discretion.

21. In order to collect year-end awards and points at any SWTHJA show you must be a current member of the Trillium Hunter Jumper Association (South West Zone), Ontario Equestrian, and Equestrian Canada and be in good standing with these associations. If the horse's owner is not the rider, the owner must also have the above noted membership in place prior to the show. You must have your memberships purchased before entering the show. Points cannot be awarded retroactively. A Horse Recording must also be current for the competition year (for all classes and divisions other than Hack Division and the Bronze Divisions) in order to collect points.

**22. Un-judged Warm-Up Rounds** – Most of the South West Trillium Shows will be offering competitors an un-judged warm-up round prior to the over fences portion of each hunter round. The round will be open to all riders, including professionals. Full dress is required. Coaches are not permitted in the ring with the exception of the Short Stirrup Division. The warm-up will be run over a set course that can only be jumped once. Two (2) refusals constitutes elimination. Each horse is limited to one (1) un-judged warm-up round prior to the division they are entered in, per ring. Equitation riders who are not competing in any other divisions may school over the set schooling course for their respective heights.

23. Pre-Entries will not be accepted if they do not reach the show secretary by the entry due date for each show. It is the responsibility of the sender to verify that the paperwork was received by the horse show secretary. Any entry received after this will be processed as a post entry.

24. Entry Fee Refunds – Scratched entries will pay the scratch fee, in full plus the administration fee. If the entry does not scratch with the show office prior to the start of their division (hunters) or class (jumpers, equitation, medal), the full entry fees will apply.

25. Obligatory Entry Form Agreement – Once an entry form is processed and accepted by the show you are obligated for the fees. If you fail to attend any such show and do not pay your entry fee in full it will affect you from showing at other Trillium shows and your THJA membership will not be renewed until payment is received by the show.

26. A penalty will be charged for each NSF cheque.

27. Minimum Entries in Order to Run A Class/Division – A division or class must have five (5) or more competitors entered in a division or class, otherwise it is at the discretion of the hosting show whether or not the division or class will be run. The class or division may also be combined with another similar class or division in order to offer the class or division.

28. Prize Money – A division or class (singular or combined) must have a total of eight (8) or more competitors for prize money to be paid. If there is a scratch before the start of the class or division, the lowered number of entries will apply. There is no prize money for any Schooling/Warm Up, Clear Round or any Equitation or Medal Classes.

29. All riders must exit the ring after the completion of each round, this includes the warm-up round, unless declared and agreed by competition management and officials.

30. No Dogs – Please leave your dogs at home. If a dog is running loose on the property a \$50.00 fee will be charged to the owner and a second offense in the same day will result in an additional \$100.00 fee. A third offense and the dog will be asked to leave the property.

31. All owners, competitors, and exhibitors are responsible for any bills for veterinary, farrier, and food services obtained at the show.

32. All vehicles must be parked in the designated areas only.

33. Hors Concours entries are not allowed at any of the SW Trillium shows.

(Eligibility as per EC Rules)

In the 2026 EC Rule Book, the guide for junior ages is:

Junior "A" – a rider who is 15, 16, 17 on January 1st.  
Junior "B" – a rider who is 12, 13, 14 on January 1st.  
Junior "C" – a rider who is under 12 on January 1st.  
Junior "A" Riders may not ride "B" or "C" ponies.  
Junior "B" Riders may ride "A", "B", or "C" ponies.  
Junior "C" Riders may ride "A", "B", or "C" ponies.

For show purposes, ponies are to be divided as follows:

"A" ponies – over 13.2 hands, but not to exceed 14.2  
hands  
"B" ponies – over 12.2 hands, but not to exceed 13.2  
hands  
"C" ponies – do not exceed 12.2 hands



**Trillium “A” Equitation Over Fences** – Open to Large Pony Division riders with fences at 2'9"; Children's Division riders with fences at 3'; and Trillium Low/High division riders with fences at 3'3". In the event a rider competes in two different divisions requiring them to jump different heights, it will be their choice which height they will jump for the equitation over fences class. This choice needs to be indicated on the entry form.

**Trillium “B” and “C” Equitation Over Fences** classes are open to small ponies with fences at 2'3", medium ponies with fences at 2'6", large ponies at 2'9" and horses at 3'.

**Adult Equitation** – Adult equitation riders must be amateurs.

A horse or pony ridden in an equitation class over fences, or in the jumper medal class may only be ridden in that class by one rider.

In the event a rider competes in two different divisions requiring them to jump different heights, it will be their choice which height they will jump for the equitation over fences class. This choice needs to be indicated on the entry form.



# TRILLIUM HUNTER MEDALS

My First Medal  
Children's Medal  
2'9" Adult Medal  
2'9" Children's Medal  
Modified Pony Medal  
2'3"/2'6" Low High Children's Medal  
2'3"/2'6" Low High Adult Medal

Originally created in the image of the Jump Canada Medal, the Trillium Medal Class has evolved into a specialty class unique to the Trillium Circuit. Where a contradiction exists, these specifications supersede those of the Equestrian Canada Jump Canada Medal. These classes are open to Junior and Amateur riders only. Riders may walk the course. Eligibility as per individual hunter division specs for the particular medal.

**First Phase** - Over Fences: Figure eight course of not less than eight jumps. Class is judged in accordance with Article G1008 Class Routine Over Fences. No additional tests over fences are permitted.

**Second Phase** - On The Flat: At the discretion of the judge, all contestants, or a minimum of ten shall be called back to perform at a walk, trot, and canter. From a maximum of four competitors, the judge may call for a minimum of two or more requirements from Article G1009 Tests (Equestrian Canada Rule Book Section G)

**Scoring** - If the judge tests over two phases, medal classes will be judged 60% over fences and 40% on the flat.  
**Tack & Equipment:** All tack and equipment remain the same for both phases. Restrictions as per Article G1003 through G1005 (Equestrian Canada Rule Book Section G)

# SILVER HUNTER DIVISIONS

**In order to ensure compliance with EC Article G201, Article 2 Pilot Program for 2026, revised specifications related to adults riding ponies are highlighted (in red) for the affected divisions. Please note that at this point the changes are only for the 2026 season and divisions may revert to the original specifications should the pilot project not continue after 2026**

EQUESTRIAN CANADA RULEBOOK PILOT PROGRAM FOR 2026  
ARTICLE G201 ARTICLE 2

This is a 1 year pilot program for 2026.

- a) Adults are permitted to show (be judged) on ponies in miscellaneous non-rated EC sanctioned classes not limited to juniors.
- b) Adult Amateurs may ride large ponies in Adult Amateur classes where fences do not exceed 3' (0.90m). See G309, G310
- c) A pony shown in any judged class(es), either hunter or jumper, by an adult may not be shown in judged classes by a junior on the same day.
- d) An adult competing on a pony in miscellaneous non-rated EC sanctioned classes must not compete higher than the pony's appropriate obstacle height as per G302.
- e) Suitability of the pony to the rider and manners of the pony must be emphasized in all classes. Judges must penalize but not necessarily eliminate an entry not having such suitability and manners.

A pony is defined as being 14.2hh's and under. A horse is defined as being over 14.2hh's.

Every pony entered in a pony division must have a valid Equestrian Canada pony measurement on file with Equestrian Canada. USEF pony measurement cards are also acceptable.

### **Small Pony Hunter Division: Fences 2'3"**

Open to ponies not exceeding 12.2hh. Small pony riders must be 14 years of age and under as of January 1st of the competition year.

### **Medium Pony Hunter Division: Fences 2'6"**

Open to ponies exceeding 12.2hh, but not exceeding 13.2hh. Medium pony riders must be 14 years of age and under as of January 1st of the competition year.

### **Large Pony Hunter Division: Fences 2'9"**

Open to ponies exceeding 13.2hh, but not exceeding 14.2hh. Large pony riders must be 17 years of age and under as of January 1st of the competition year.

### **Modified Pony Hunter**

Open to all ponies. Ponies will jump 3" below their regular pony hunter division height and distances will be adjusted according to pony size as per EC Rules G306.6.A. Age restrictions as per EC Rules G306.1. Pony/rider combinations may not cross enter into any other classes or divisions requiring them to jump with the exception of the Modified Pony Medal and their age respective equitation on the flat.

Small – Not to exceed 2'

Medium – Not to exceed 2'3"

Large – Not to exceed 2'6"

### **Short Stirrup Division: Fences not to exceed 21" (Verticals Only)**

Open to "C" riders. Open to both horses and ponies, distances will not be adjusted. Riders may not enter any other classes except for "C" Equitation on the flat and My First Medal. Riders in the under saddle class must be short stirrup eligible.

# ADULT AMATEUR DIVISIONS

All adult amateurs must possess a current EC amateur card which is purchased annually.

## **Adult Amateur Hunter: Fences 3'**

As per Equestrian Canada Article G309. Open to horses and large ponies. **A pony ridden by an adult cannot be shown by a junior at the same competition on the same day (G201.2(c)).** Riders in this division may cross enter to the Low Hunter and the Trillium Hunter Division at 3'3".

## **2'9" Adult Amateur Hunter Division: Fences 2'9"**

**Open to horses and large ponies. A pony ridden by an adult cannot be shown by a junior at the same competition on the same day (G201.2(c)).** A horse/rider combination may only cross enter into the hack division, the low/high open hunter division, the 2'9 adult medal, and adult equitation on the flat class. Riders may enter any other division or class at that show on another horse or pony. The horse may be shown in another class/division with another rider.

## **2'3"/2'6" Low High Adult Amateur Hunter Division**

Open to adult amateur riders on horses and ponies. A small pony may only compete at the 2'3" height of this division. **A pony ridden by an adult cannot be shown by a junior at the same competition on the same day (G201.2(c)).** Distances will not be adjusted. Riders may compete in any eligible division with a height 2'6" and under. If also competing in the low/high open hunter division, they are only eligible to compete at the 2'6" (low) height. Horse/rider combinations are also permitted to show in the hack division, the 2'3"/2'6" Low High Adult Medal and adult equitation on the flat. Competitors may move up or down a height throughout the season but cannot change heights at an individual show.

# JUNIOR DIVISIONS

Open to horses ridden by juniors.

## **Children's Hunter: Fences 3'0"**

As per Equestrian Canada Rules Article G307. Riders in this division may cross enter to the Low Hunter and the Trillium Hunter Division at 3'3".

## **2'9' Children's Hunter Division: Fences 2'9"**

A horse/rider combination may only cross enter into the hack division, the low/high open hunter division, the 2'9 children's medal, and age-appropriate equitation on the flat class. Riders may enter any other division or class at that show on another horse or pony. The horse may be shown in another class/division with another rider.

## **2'3"/2'6" Low High Children's Hunter Division**

Open to junior riders on horses and ponies. **A pony ridden by an adult cannot be shown by a junior at the same competition (G201.2).** Distances will not be adjusted. Riders may compete in any eligible division with a height 2'6 and under. If also competing in the low/high open hunter division, they are only eligible to compete at the 2'6 (low) height. Horse/rider combinations are also permitted to show in the hack division, age appropriate equitation on the flat and the 2'3"/2'6" Low High Children's Medal. Competitors may move up or down a height throughout the season but cannot change heights at an individual show.

# OPEN DIVISIONS

## **Low/High Open Hunter Division: Fences 2'6" and 2'9"**

**This division is open to all horses and medium and large ponies. A medium pony ridden by an adult may only compete at the 2'6" height. A pony ridden by an adult cannot be shown by a junior at the same competition on the same day (G201.2(c)).** Horse/rider combinations may only cross enter to divisions requiring them to jump 2'9" and under, hack division, and their age-appropriate equitation on the flat. Competitors may move both up and down in heights between shows, but competitors may not change heights once the division has started. Competitors must declare height on their Entry Form.

Note: 2'3"/2'6" Low High Adult Amateur Hunter and 2'3"/2'6" Low High Children's Hunter competitors may only jump at the 2'6" height in this division.

## **Low Hunter: Fences 3'**

Open to all horses and riders.

## **Trillium Hunter – Low/High: Fences 3'3" and 3'6"**

The low option of this division is open to all eligible riders. This division is not open to riders competing in the Children's 2'6" and 2'9" and Adult Amateur 2'6" and 2'9" Hunter Divisions.

The Trillium Hunter and Low Hunter Divisions may be combined at the 2025 Championships

## **Hack Division**

As per Equestrian Canada Chapter 12 and 13 – Classes Refer to Article G1301-1303.

# TRILLIUM JUMPER MEDAL

This class is open to Junior and Amateur riders only and competitors will have the option to compete at either .9M or 1.0M. Competitors must declare their preferred height when making their entry. This class will have both a jumping phase and a flat phase with additional testing options at the judge's discretion. Jumping phase to be ridden first. Judged 60% over fences and 40% on the flat.

**Tack & Equipment:** All tack and equipment remain the same for both phases. Only running martingales used in the conventional manner are permitted. No standing martingales, draw reins or restricted running martingales are permitted. Conservative coloured headgear (As per Article G1109) with no additional adornment. Stirrups are restricted as per Article G1109-G).

**Jumping Phase:** The jumping phase should be over an equitation type course of at least nine (9) fences. Fences will not exceed .90M or 1.0M in height with a spread not to exceed the height. The course must contain at least one double or triple combination with at least one spread fence. Other spread fences are required elsewhere on the course.

**Flat Phase:** All riders, or a maximum of 12 who complete the jumping phase, shall be called back to perform on the flat and demonstrate tests on the flat of the judge's choosing. The top four (4) riders in the flat phase may then be asked to complete a short test including fences determined by the judge. When this test is being ridden, the riders will turn their backs so they cannot watch the other competitors.

# 0.75 M JUMPER MEDAL

## PILOT PROJECT FOR 2026

This class is open to Junior and Amateur riders only. This class will have both a jumping phase and a flat phase with additional testing options at the judge's discretion. Jumping phase to be ridden first. Judged 60% over fences and 40% on the flat.

**Tack & Equipment:** All tack and equipment remains the same for both phases. Only running martingales used in the conventional manner are permitted. No standing martingales, draw reins or restricted running martingales are permitted. Conservative coloured headgear (As per Article G1109) with no additional adornment. Stirrups are restricted as per Article G1109-G).

**Jumping Phase:** The jumping phase should be over an equitation type course of at least nine (9) fences. Fences will not exceed .75M in height with a spread not to exceed the height.

**Flat Phase:** All riders, or a maximum of 12 who complete the jumping phase, may be called back to perform on the flat and demonstrate tests on the flat of the judge's choosing. The top four (4) riders in the flat phase may then be asked to complete a short test including fences determined by the judge. When this test is being ridden, the riders will turn their backs so they cannot watch the other competitors.

# SILVER JUMPER DIVISIONS

## **0.90M Jumper Division**

Open to all horses and ponies. Maximum spread 1M.  
Run under Table A.

## **1.0M Jumper Division**

Open to all horses and ponies. Maximum spread 1.10M.  
Run under Table A.

## **1.10M. – Trillium Jumper Division**

Open to all horses. Maximum spread 1.20M. Run under  
Table A.

The 1.0M Jumper and 1.1 Jumper Divisions may be  
combined at the 2026 Championships



# **BRONZE BY THE THJA DIVISIONS**

These divisions are sanctioned Bronze by Equestrian  
Canada

## **Junior/Amateur Cross Rail Hunter Division – 12”**

Open to all horses and ponies, distances will not be adjusted. Riders must be a junior or amateur as defined by Equine Canada rules. A pony ridden by an adult cannot be shown by a junior at the same competition on the same day (G201.2(c)). Riders may only cross-enter into age-appropriate equitation on the flat and hack division (and any specialty class(es) at the Trillium Championships designed specifically for riders in this Division).

## **Junior/Amateur Long Stirrup Hunter Division 21” (Verticals Only)**

Open to junior riders 12 years of age and older on January 1st and adult amateur riders on horses and ponies.

Distances will not be adjusted. A pony ridden by an adult cannot be shown by a junior at the same competition on the same day (G201.2(c)). Long stirrup riders may not enter any other classes except for age-appropriate equitation on the flat and hack division (and any specialty class(es) at the Trillium Championships designed specifically for riders in this Division).

# BRONZE BY THE THJA DIVISIONS

## **2'3" Open Hunter Division – Fences 2'3"**

Open to all horses and ponies, distances will not be adjusted. A pony ridden by an adult cannot be shown by a junior at the same competition on the same day (G201.2(c)).

## **0.65M Jumper Division (Pilot Project for 2026)**

Open to all riders. Open to all horses and ponies. No combinations. Time allowed of 325 metres per minute. Run under Table A

## **0.75M Jumper Division**

Open to all horses and ponies. Maximum spread .85m. Combinations are limited to a minimum of two strides -- vertical to vertical or oxer to vertical.

# SAFETY, INCLUSIVITY, & EXCELLENCE

Your guide to the latest updates for the competition season in Canada

IMPORTANT CHANGES have been implemented to enhance the safety and inclusivity of equestrian sport. Whether you're an athlete, parent, coach, official, or competition staff, your role is crucial in upholding these standards. Here's what you need to know:

### SAFE SPORT TRAINING PREREQUISITE:

- The two free EC Safe Sport training modules must be completed before purchasing a Sport Licence. Check your training status on MyEC by clicking on the ECampus button.

### DISCONTINUED TEMPORARY LICENCES AND TEMPORARY HORSE REGISTRATIONS:

- Temporary EC Sport Licences are now discontinued at competitions. All riders, owners, and coaches must possess an EC Sport Licence to participate in events. All horses must have a Horse Recording where level and division require.

### AVAILABLE SHOW LEVEL UPGRADES:

- Explore higher-level competitions with temporary upgrades via your MyEC Portal. Note: National Rankings Points are not tabulated for upgraded results.

### COACH STATUS REMINDER—2026 SEASON

- Coaches attending EC-Sanctioned competition must hold a valid Licensed Coach Status. Any Coach with Registered Coach Status must purchase a Single Event Upgrade for \$55.00. This purchase can be made through the My EC account.
- Coaches without a valid Licensed Coach Status or Registered Coach Status with Single Event Upgrade Status are not eligible to be represented as a coach at EC-Sanctioned events and may be subject to fines. Please complete your requirements in advance to avoid any fines and delays.

### DECLARE YOURSELF A SELF-COACHED ATHLETE

- Athletes without a coach on-site can declare themselves as self-coached by entering their own **EC SPORT LICENSE NUMBER** or enter "self-coached" in the **COACH FIELD** on their registration/entry form.
- Please note: Coaches that **DO NOT ATTEND** the events **SHOULD NOT BE LISTED** on the entry form.



“ When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments. ”
