Board and Committe Reports

Report of Accountant Melody McKinnon gave an account of the 2019 season and applauded Rachel for all of her hard work. Our account is in good shape.

Business as specified

Omnibus: Ashline will do the omnibus again for the 2020 season, updating the new rules and taking out the warm up rule of only 7 fences. She will be paid \$500 for her work.

Perfect Attendance Award: The perfect attendance award will be for the competitors who attend all of the 9 shows in 2020. I persons name will be drawn and presented at the banquet and will receive free entries for the 2020 show season.

Show Dates and Schedules: All of the show dates and schedules are online, it was suggested that F&M look at their show date and possibly change as there might be a conflict with the Angelstone series. High Street will be held at Highland Green

Combining Divisions: The numbers are down and 108 entries are needed for the show managers to break even. Combining divisions and prize money not offered to the division that have low entries. We will wait to get feedback from the coaches. It is a possibility we could go back to a 1 day show, but could run into conflicts. 2 days with 1 ring is a possibility but will have to reach out to the coaches again to get ideas of the numbers before making and decisions.

The general feeling is the Prelude shows are overpowering the Trillium shows. There is a need to encourage people to come to the Trillium shows and try to educate people and to make a different between the Prelude circuit and the Trillium circuit.

Volunteers: Volunteers are always needed.

Show Specs – Proposals: Changes are to be submitted before March1st, the committee reviews the changes later in March and the changes are voted on in October the same year.

Strategic Planning: What is good: Championship show, standardization, affordable compared to the A circuit, there are a variety of divisions and good officials.

Not so good: communication, not enough volunteers, decreased membership and no financial support.

The realities are a diversity in memberships affordability and competition from other circuits. The Trillium show have the most membership in Ontario.
