Welcome to the 2023 South West Trillium Circuit.

We are excited to bring some new changes for 2023. New for this year, is 'Travel the THJA'. Trillium members can compete any Trillium show in Ontario throughout the season to earn points for the Provincial Championships. Members will declare their home zone, and must compete in 50% of the shows in their home zone, but are then free to attend any other shows to make up their season.

We do note that only points earned at South West shows will count towards the South West Year End awards.

We are offering 5 shows this year in South West, so riders must compete at 3 shows to be eligible for Championships and South West Year End awards.

We wish to congratulate Madison Perkins who was our Perfect Attendance winner and will be receiving free entries to all the South West Trillium shows in 2023. Your South West Show managers are excited to be offering the Perfect Attendance award again in 2023. Julie Claus was the coach with the most students with Perfect Attendance. We will be continuing our Coach award again in 2023.

A few points to remember:

In order to collect points in your divisions and classes, make sure you have all your memberships (EC, OE, THJA) in place prior to the first show. Owners and Riders in Silver divisions must have an EC Silver, OE and THJA membership. Owners and Riders in the Bronze divisions must have an EC Bronze, OE and THJA membership. Horses require a digital Horse Recording for all classes other than the Hack Division and Bronze Divisions. THJA memberships are required only if you wish to collect points towards Championships and year end awards. Points cannot be awarded retroactively, so make sure you have them before the first show!!!

The Trillium shows listed in this program are recognized provincial circuit competitions of Equestrian Canada and are governed by the rules of the Federation.

Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to the humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

EC is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of all horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
 - Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- Ensuring that owners, trainers and exhibitors or their agents, use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- Requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within the industry regulations in all equestrian competition;
 - Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horses.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and competition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane.

Neither the Southwest Trillium Circuit, the Show committee, the Show facilities and the owners or any of its staff or agents shall be in any way liable for any accident, injury, damage, loss, or for any other matter that may happen, from any cause or circumstances whatsoever to competitors, exhibitors, members, or their agents or to anyone on the competition grounds or to any animal or article exhibited or to any property brought on the competition grounds or for any other loss, claim, matter, circumstance, or even whatsoever in connection with or arising out of or attributable to the competition or any journey to or from the competition. It is understood and agreed that under no circumstances shall the Southwest Trillium Circuit and All Show facilities, its owners, agents, or employees be liable for any loss, damages, claims, or costs occasioned or suffered by any competitor, exhibitor, member, or their agents, directly or indirectly, howsoever arising, including without limitation, losses, damages, claims, or costs as a result of the Southwest Trillium Circuit and All Show facilities, its owners, agents, or employees from and against any and all such loss, claims, or costs.

- Competitors may only collect points if they have a current THJA
 Membership.
 - The top seven (7) competitors in each division are eligible for Trillium Championship Show
- Competitors must compete (Compete = Marked on a Judge's Card) at a minimum of 50% of the THJA shows in the Zone in their respective division or class
 - In the instance that someone in the top seven (7) of the division opts not to attend, the Trillium Championship show, the competitor in eight (8th) place will be eligible to attend.
 - Horse/rider combinations may only collect points in one of the THJA zones. They zone they wish to collect points in must be the zone on their THJA membership card.
- Riders are permitted to show in more than one zone, but they must have a THJA membership for each zone in which they will be collecting points.
- Both owners and riders must have THJA membership to collect points towards Championship show and Zone Awards.
 - Points are not retroactive if memberships were not in place at the time of competition.
 - Competitors may not collect points on Temporary Horse

Licenses.

- Points towards Championship Show and Zone Awards are calculated at each show based on the number of riders in the class, a standard multiplier factor, and the placings 1st to 6th. Please note that this is different than how points are calculated for Champion and Reserve Champion at individual horse shows.
- Competitors must compete (Compete = Marked on a Judge's Card) at a minimum of 50% of the THJA shows in the Zone in their respective division or class.

** ENTRIES BEYOND 10TH PLACE WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED IN THE EVENT OF VACANCIES IN ANY DIVISION OR CLASS FOR THE CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW. **

"THE 2023 TOUR"

The THJA will be accepting points collected anywhere in Ontario at Trillium Shows towards Trillium Championships qualification. How does it work?

Declare your home zone by purchasing a membership in the zone you wish to represent on the Trillium Championship Points system. Membership is now open for 2023!

HOME ZONE: This is the zone you will represent at Trillium Championships. You must show 50% of the shows in your home zone, but may travel to any other Trillium competitions in the province to collect additional points towards qualifying for Champs. You may also stay within your home zone and collect points close to home if you prefer.

TRILLIUM CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS: These points are held centrally by the THJA and will reflect each member's standing in the organization as a whole. Championship entries will be accepted based on these standings and a quota system by geographic zone. Each zone will still receive seven spots, but in the event that they do not fill all spots wildcard spaces will be available to the next highest ranked competitor in the THJA points regardless of their zone.

NOTE: Zones will be able to set their own requirements for zone and banquet awards.

POINTS PROCESS FOR SOUTH WEST AWARDS IN 2023

Only points earned at South West Trillium shows will count towards our Year End awards. Competitors must compete (marked on judge's card) in 50% of the shows in order to be eligible. This year, that will be 3 shows.

POINTS PROCESS FOR SOUTHWEST IN 2023

Lacey May Jamieson (1997 - 2013) is fondly remembered and honoured each year with the awarding of the Lacey May Jamieson Memorial Trophy. This award is lovingly sponsored each year by Vicki Edgar of Cohen Highly Law Firm and is presented to the Zone Champion of the 1.1m Jumper Division.

Lacey Jamieson was a hard-working and dedicated rider, who competed on the South West Trillium Circuit. She was always known to have a smile on her face and a great positive attitude, as well as being helpful and encouraging to her fellow competitors. She was well liked by our local equestrian community and also, with the help of Social Media, the Global equestrian community.

Sadly, on October 13, 2013 at the age of 16, Lacey passed away suddenly of a rare blood disease called Hemophagocytic Lymphohistiocytosis (HLH). Lacey's bond with horses, presence and beautiful smile are sadly missed by all of the South West Community.



Riley Dobson (2000-2016) was an active competitor on the Ontario Trillium Circuit, in both the Central West and South West regions. Tragically, on February 22, 2016, Riley passed away due to complications from a helicopter accident. Riley made his mark on the South West community in a short time, forming many strong friendships, and is sadly missed.

The Riley Dobson Memorial Award is a nominated award open to a South West Trillium Hunter Jumper Association member who exemplifies the qualities most remembered in Riley.

Riley was known for his desire to learn; for his hard work and dedication to the sport; for supporting all other competitors; for his mismatched socks, and for always putting the horse first. This award celebrates the qualities that Riley stood for. #WWRD

Frances 'Sanie' Fleming Mordue (1932-2019) was a long time Senior Steward for Equestrian Canada and a very familiar face on the South West Trillium Circuit in the 80s and 90s. She will be remembered for her friendly, smiling face, fair attitude and no-nonsense approach to the rules and welfare of the horse. Sanie lost her courageous battle with cancer on November 9, 2019 in her 87th year.

The South West Trillium Circuit is very honoured to be able to recognize Sanie's influence in the equestrian world annually with our Horse Show Improvement award in her honour.

The award will be presented to the South West Trillium show that has demonstrated the most improvement each year as determined by the Show Standards Committee and competitor feedback.

HOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. South West Trillium shows are sanctioned as a: Silver competition member of Equestrian Canada 308 Legget Drive, Suite 100, Ottawa, Ontario, K2K 1Y6 and are governed by the rules of EC.
- 2. Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book.
- 3. Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person(s) responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider, and horse shall be subject to the constitution and rules of Equestrian Canada and any additional rules set by the competition.
- 4. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC- sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition.

5. Per Article A402, All Canadian entries are required to hold an EC Horse Recording and have paid the EC Horse Recording annual Activation Fee to compete, or if owned by a temporary sport license holder, a Temporary Horse Registration form must be purchased at each competition entered. Foreign entries must sign an affidavit. (See A404) Horses entered in the Hack Division only, are not required to have an EC Horse Recording. Anyone leasing a horse/pony cannot

apply for a Horse Recording.

6. ALL HORSES ATTENDING EQUESTRIAN CANADA SANCTIONED COMPETITIONS MUST HAVE MET THE REQUIREMENTS OF ARTICLE A519, VACCINATIONS. SEE RULES OF EQUESTRIAN CANADA, SECTION A, GENERAL REGULATIONS, ARTICLE A519, VACCINATIONS.

7. Accidents and Return to Play — See EC Rule (A101) for full details This rule applies to all SWTHIA shows. In the event of a fall/accident where a concussion can be reasonably suspected, the competitor must receive medical clearance by qualified medical personnel onsite, through the EC Accident Injury Report Form before continuing. If the qualified medical personnel suspects a concussion, or believes that the competitor may be at risk of concussion due to the nature of the fall or impact, the competitor is suspended from competition until medically released. Suspended competitors must submit the EC Return to Play Form to EC which must be completed by a licensed physician. The EC Return to Play Form will be processed by EC within two business days, at which point the competitor will be removed from the EC Medical Suspension list and may return to regular competition. If the competitor wishes to compete at their own risk after being medically released by a physician but before the EC processing period of the form, the competitor must also submit a copy of the EC Return to Play Form to the show secretary.

8. Person Responsible — See EC Glossary

The Person Responsible (PR) for a horse must be an adult who has, or shares responsibility for the care, training, custody, and performance of the horse and who has official responsibility for that horse under EC Rules. The PR is liable under the penalty provisions of the applicable EC Rules for any rule violations. Every entry form for an EC sanctioned competition must identify the PR and be signed by the PR. The Person Responsible is ultimately responsible for the condition, fitness and management of the horse and is alone responsible for any act performed by himself/herself or by any other person with authorized access to the horse in the stables, elsewhere on the grounds, or while the horse is being ridden, driven or exercised. A: For adult entries into EC sanctioned competitions the PR shall be either the trainer, the owner of the horse of the competitor who rides or drives the horse during the EC sanctioned competition.

B: For Junior entries into EC sanctioned competitions the Junior competitor cannot be the PR. For Junior entries the PR may be either the trainer, the owner of the horse, or a parent/guardian of the Junior competitor.

9. Article A905 Headgear — At all times, persons mounted at an EC-sanctioned event location must wear approved protective headgear. Protective headgear must be: a) approved by an accredited certification organization; b) properly fitted; and c) securely fastened by a safety harness permanently affixed to the helmet. Protective headgear must be certified under one of the following standards: ASTM (American Society for Testing Materials), or SEI (Safety Equipment Institute, Inc.); BSI/BS EN (British Standards Institution); EN (European Union Standards; AS/NZS (Australian/New Zealand Standards; or CE VG1 01.040 2014-12. EC and SWTHJA make no representation or warranty, expressed or implied, about any approved protective headgear. EC and SWTHJA caution riders that serious injury or death may result despite wearing such headgear, as all equestrian sports involve inherent risk, and no protective headgear can protect against all foreseeable injury.

SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

SHOW RULES AND REGULATION

10. Article A102 Safe Sport Environments 1. Effective 2022, EC Sport License holders at least 18 years of age must complete recognized safe sport training modules addressing the recognition and prevention of maltreatment in sport and concussion. 2. Effective 2022, Coach Status is required to engage in coaching activities at EC sanctioned events.

- 11. When registering for EC Sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self coached. Coaches from other countries must be in good standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada. Section A General Regulations, Article 102.
- 12. Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location.
- 13. Every entry will be provided an identification number by the competition organizing committee which must be worn and visible at all times in the schooling and/or exercise areas as well as in the competition ring.
- 14. All Protests must be made in writing and addressed to the show steward in writing. Every Protest must be signed and must be accompanied by a deposit of \$100 in cash.
- 15. A signed, open cheque or the value of the full entry fee in cash, must be provided to the show secretary before the competitors' number will be issued.
- 16. Shows of the SWTHJA reserve the right to refuse any entries at their discretion.

17. ALL SHOW SCHEDULES ARE TENTATIVE AND SUBJECT TO CHANGE AT THE DISCRETION OF SHOW MANAGEMENT AT ANY TIME.

- 18. In order to collect year-end awards and points at any SWTHJA show you must be a current member of the Trillium Hunter Jumper Association, Ontario Equestrian Federation, and Equestrian Canada and be in good standing with these associations. If the horse's owner is not the rider, the owner must also have the above noted membership in place prior to the show. You must have your memberships purchased before entering the show. Points cannot be awarded retroactively.
- 19. In order to qualify for year end awards, competitors must finish in the top 7 of their division or class, having competed in at least 50% of the shows in the division they wish to qualify in.
- 20. Un-judged Warm-Up Rounds Most of the South West Trillium Shows will be offering competitors an un-judged warm-up round prior to the over fences portion of each hunter round. The round will be open to all riders, including professionals. Full dress is required. Coaches are not permitted in the ring with the exception of the Short Stirrup Division. The warm-up will be run over a set course that can only be jumped once. Two (2) refusals constitutes elimination. Each horse is limited to one (1) un-judged warm-up round prior to the division they are entered in, per ring. Equitation riders who are not competing in any other divisions may school over the set schooling course for their respective heights.
- 21. Pre-Entries will not be accepted if they do not reach the show secretary by the entry due date for each show. It is the responsibility of the sender to verify that the paperwork was received by the horse show secretary. Any entry received after this will be processed as a post entry.

22. ENTRY FEE REFUNDS – SCRATCHED ENTRIES WILL PAY THE SCRATCH FEE, IN FULL WITH THE ADMINISTRATION FEE. IF THE ENTRY DOES NOT SCRATCH WITH THE SHOW OFFICE, THE FULL ENTRY FEES WILL APPLY ONCE THE DIVISION (HUNTERS) OR CLASS (JUMPERS, EQUITATION, MEDAL) HAS STARTED.

23. Obligatory Entry Form Agreement — Once an entry form is processed and accepted by the show you are obligated for the fees. If you fail to attend any such show and do not pay your entry fee in full it will affect you from showing at other Trillium shows and your THJA membership will not be renewed until payment is received by the show.

24. A penalty will be charged for each NSF cheque.

25. Minimum Entries in Order to Run A Class/Division — A division or class must have five (5) or more competitors entered in a division or class, otherwise it is at the discretion of the hosting show whether or not the division or class will be run.

26. MINIMUM ENTRIES FOR PRIZE MONEY – A DIVISION MUST HAVE EIGHT (8) OR MORE COMPETITORS FOR PRIZE MONEY TO BE PAID. SHOULD THERE BE FEWER THAN EIGHT (8) COMPETITORS, NO PRIZE MONEY WILL BE PAID AND THE DIVISION ENTRY FEE WILL BE REDUCED BY \$20.00. THIS RULE DOES NOT APPLY WHERE DIVISIONS HAVE BEEN COMBINED AND THERE ARE EIGHT (8) OR MORE COMPETITORS.

27. All riders must exit the ring after the completion of each round, this includes the warm-up round.

SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

28. No Dogs — Please leave your dogs at home. If a dog is running loose on the property a \$50.00 fee will be charged to the owner and a second offense in the same day will result in an additional \$100.00 fee. A third offense and the dog will be asked to leave the property.

29. All owners, competitors, and exhibitors are responsible for any bills for veterinary, farrier, and food services obtained at the show.

30. All vehicles must be parked in the designated areas only.

31. Hors Concours entries are not allowed at any of the SW Trillium shows.

DIVISION SPECIFICATIONS

Equitation is judged on rider ability. The rider competes either over fences or on the flat and they are judged on both their position and their correct use of the aids to produce an accurate ride. Conservative, traditional attire is required. Gloves are expected. Black or brown smooth leather half chaps are permissible providing they match the boot colour. Only approved helmets of a conservative colour are allowed. See Equestrian Canada Rules Section G Article G1003 for dress requirements.

A horse or pony ridden in an Equitation Class Over Fences, or in the Jumper Medal Class may only be ridden in that class by one rider.

IN THE 2022 EC RULE BOOK, THE GUIDE FOR JUNIOR AGES IS:

JUNIOR "A" — a rider who is 15, 16, 17 on January 1st **JUNIOR "B"** — a rider who is 12, 13, 14 on January 1st **JUNIOR "C"** — a rider who is under 12 on January 1st

Junior "A" Riders may not ride "B" or "C" ponies. Junior "B" Riders may ride "A", "B", or "C" ponies. Junior "C" Riders may ride "A", "B", or "C" ponies.

FOR SHOW PURPOSES, PONIES ARE TO BE DIVIDED AS FOLLOWS:

"A" PONIES – over 13.2 hands, but not to exceed 14.2 hands
"B" PONIES – over 12.2 hands, but not to exceed 13.2 hands
"C" PONIES – do not exceed 12.2 hands

"A" EQUITATION OVER FENCES — Open to riders on Large Ponies with fences at 2'9"; and on horses at 3' or 3'3". In the event that a rider competes in two different divisions requiring them to jump different heights, it will be their choice which height they will jump for the Equitation over fences class. This choice needs to be indicated on the entry form.

"B" AND "C" EQUITATION OVER FENCES — Open to riders on Small Ponies with fences at 2'3", Medium Ponies at 2'6", Large Ponies at 2'9" and horses at 3'

 $\label{eq:adult_equitation} \textbf{ADULT EQUITATION} - \textbf{Adult Equitation Riders must be amateurs.}$

Originally created in the image of the Jump Canada Medal, the Trillium Medal Class has evolved into a specialty class unique to the Trillium Circuit. Where a contradiction exists, these specifications supersede those of the Equestrian Canada Jump Canada Medal. These classes are open to Junior and Amateur riders only. Riders may walk the course. Eligibility as per individual hunter division specs for that particular medal.

FIRST PHASE - OVER FENCES: Figure eight course of not less than eight jumps. Class is judged in accordance to Article G1008 Class Routine Over Fences. No additional tests over fences are permitted.

SECOND PHASE - ON THE FLAT: All contestants, or a minimum of ten shall be called back to perform at a walk, trot and canter. From a maximum of four competitors, the judge may call for a minimum of two or more requirements from Article G1009 Tests (Equestrian Canada Rule Book Section G) Scoring: Medal classes will be judged 60% over fences and 40% on the flat.

SCORING: Medal classes will be judged 60% over fences and 40% on the flat.

TACK & EQUIPMENT: All tack and equipment remains the same for both phases. Restrictions as per Article G1003 through G1005 (Equestrian Canada Rule Book Section G)

TRILLIUM JUMPER MEDAL: FENCES NOT TO EXCEED 1 METRE

Originally created on the image of the CET Medal, the Trillium Jumper Medal has evolved into a specialty class unique to the Trillium Circuit.

These specifications supersede those of the Equestrian Canada CET medal. The class will have both a jumping phase and a flat phase. This class is open to Junior and Amateur riders only. It is judged as an equitation class with both a jumping and flat phase.

Jumping phase to be ridden first.

TACK & EQUIPMENT: All tack and equipment remains the same for both phases. Only running martingales used in the conventional manner are permitted. No standing martingales, draw reins or restricted running martingales are permitted. Conservative coloured headgear (As per Article G1109) with no additional adornment. Stirrups are restricted as per Article G1109-G)

JUDGING: Jumping phase to be conducted under current Equine Canada jumper rules. In addition, the class will be judged on seat, hand, guidance and control. Jumper Medal to be judged 60% over fences and 40% on the flat.

JUMPING PHASE: The jumping phase should be over a course of at least nine (9) fences. Fences will not exceed I Metre in height with a spread not to exceed the height. The course must contain at least one double or triple combination with at least one spread fence. Other spread fences are required elsewhere on the course. A Liverpool is optional.

FLAT PHASE - All riders, or a maximum of twelve who complete the Jumping Phase, shall be called back to perform on the flat. During the flat phase, riders will show a working walk, the working trot sitting, the working trot rising, and showing a lengthening of stride, the working canter and the working canter showing a lengthening of stride. The working canter on the counter lead must be demonstrated for at least one full revolution of the ring in each direction. The top four riders in the flat phase may be asked to complete a short test determined by the judge. When this test is being ridden, the other riders will turn their backs so they cannot watch.

HUNTER DIVISIONS

A hunter is judged on performance, style of jumping and movement. Judges are looking for the athletic ability of the animal both over fences and under saddle.

SMALL PONY HUNTER DIVISION: FENCES 2'3"

Open to ponies not exceeding 12.2hh. Small pony riders must be 14 years of age and under as of January 1st of the competition year.

MEDIUM PONY HUNTER DIVISION: FENCES 2'6"

Open to ponies exceeding 12.2hh, but not exceeding 13.2hh. Medium pony riders must be 14 years of age and under as of January 1st of the competition year.

LARGE PONY HUNTER DIVISION: FENCES 2'9"

Open to ponies exceeding 13.2hh, but not exceeding 14.2hh. Large pony riders must be 17 years of age and under as of January 1st of the competition year.

MODIFIED PONY HUNTER

Open to all ponies. Ponies will jump 3" below their regular pony hunter division height and distances will be adjusted according to pony size as per EC Rules G306.6.A. Age restrictions as per EC Rules G306.1.

Pony/rider combinations may not cross enter into any other classes or divisions requiring them to jump.

SMALL - Not to exceed 2'

MEDIUM — Not to exceed 2'3"

LARGE - Not to exceed 2'6"

ONY DIVISIONS AND SHORT STIRRU

SHORT STIRRUP DIVISION: 21" VERTICALS ONLY.

Open to "C" riders. Riders may not enter any other classes except for "C" Equitation on the flat and MyFirst Medal. Open to both horses and ponies, distances will not be adjusted. Riders in the flat class must be short stirrup eligible.

ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER DIVISIONS

All adult amateurs must possess a current EC amateur card which is purchased annually.

Adult amateurs may ride horses or large ponies. Please note that a pony ridden by an adult cannot be shown by a junior at the same competition (G201.2)

ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER: FENCES 3'

As per Equestrian Canada Article G309. Riders in this division may cross enter to the Trillium Hunter Division at 3'3".

2'9" ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER DIVISION: FENCES 2'9"

A horse/rider combination may only cross enter into the hack division, the Low/High Open Hunter Division, the Modified Adult Medal, and Adult Equitation on the flat. Riders may enter in any other division or class at that show on another horse or pony. The horse may be shown in another class/division with another rider.

2'6" ADULT AMATEUR DIVISION: FENCES 2'6"

Riders are not eligible to compete in any division requiring them to jump with a height over 2'6", except for the Low/High Open Hunter division. Horse/rider combinations are also permitted to show in the Hack Division and the Adult Equitation on the flat.

NDULT AMATEUR HUNTER DIVISIONS

Open to horses ridden by juniors.

CHILDREN'S HUNTER: FENCES 3'0"

As per Equestrian Canada Rules Article G307.

2'9" CHILDREN'S HUNTER DIVISION: FENCES 2'9"

A horse/rider combination may only cross enter into the hack division, the Low/High Open Hunter Division, the Modified Children's Medal, and age appropriate Equitation on the flat. Riders may enter in any other division or class at that show on another horse or pony. The horse may be shown in another class/division with another rider.

2'6" CHILDREN'S DIVISION: FENCES 2'6"

Riders are not eligible to compete in any division requiring them to jump with a height over 2'6", except for the Low/High Open Hunter Division. Horse/rider combinations are also permitted to show in the hack division and age appropriate Equitation on the flat.

LOW/HIGH OPEN HUNTER DIVISION: FENCES 2'6" AND 2'9"

Open to all horses. No ponies are permitted. Horse/rider combinations may only cross enter to divisions requiring them to jump 2'9" and under, Hack Division, and age appropriate Equitation on the flat. Competitors may move both up and down in heights between shows, but competitors may not change heights once the division has started.

LOW HUNTER: FENCES 3'

Open to all horses.

TRILLIUM HUNTER - LOW/HIGH: FENCES 3'3" AND 3'6"

The low option of this division is open to all eligible riders. The high option of this division is not open to Children's, Adult Amateur Division riders or riders in the Low Children's and Low Adult Divisions.

HACK DIVISION

As per Equestrian Canada Chapter 12 and 13 — Classes Refer to Article G1301-1303

Certain divisions may be combined at qualifying competitions throughout the season, however they will run as separate divisions at the Championships.

JUMPER DIVISIONS

Horses are to be judged only on performance over a pre-designated course. The competition management must ensure that a plan giving precise detail of the course is posted at least 30 minutes before start of competition. Jumper tack as per Equestrian Canada Rules.

0.90M JUMPER DIVISION

Open to all horses and ponies. Maximum spread Im. Run under Table A.

1.0M JUMPER DIVISION

Open to all horses and ponies. Maximum spread 1.10m. Run under Table A.

1.10M. – TRILLIUM JUMPER DIVISION

Open to all horses. Maximum spread 1.20m. Run under Table A.

Certain divisions may be combined at qualifying competitions throughout the season, however they will run as separate divisions at the Championships.

CROSS RAIL HUNTER DIVISION - 12"

Open to all horses and ponies, distances will not be adjusted. Riders may only cross-enter into age appropriate equitation on the flat and hack division.

LONG STIRRUP HUNTER DIVISION - 21" VERTICALS ONLY

Open to riders 12 years of age and older on January 1st. Long stirrup riders may not enter any other classes except for age appropriate equitation on the flat and hack division. Open to both horses and ponies, distances will not be adjusted.

2'3" OPEN HUNTER DIVISION - FENCES 2'3"

Open to all horses and ponies, distances will not be adjusted.

0.75M JUMPER DIVISION

Open to all horses and ponies. Maximum spread .85m. Combinations are limited to a minimum of two strides -- vertical to vertical or oxer to vertical.
